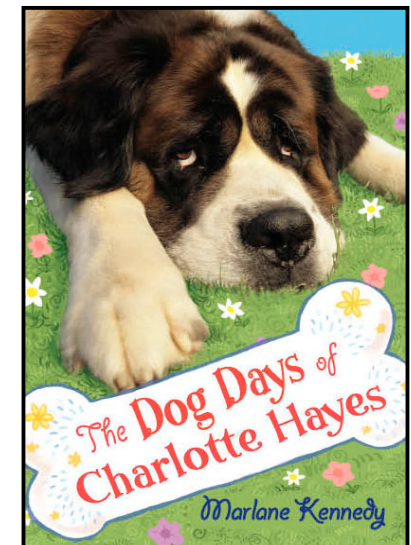
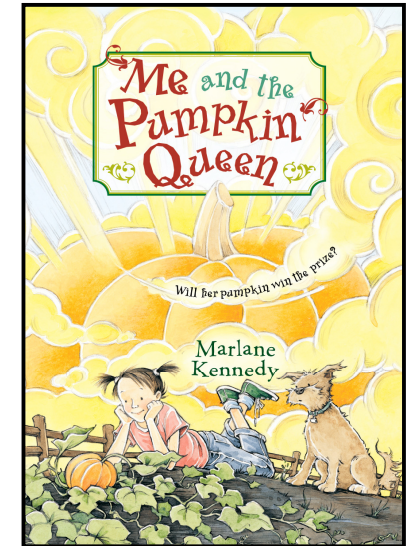

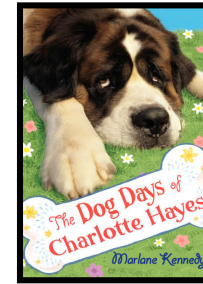
### Get a Clue! The Power of Research

Marlane discusses how she was able to write about a subject she knew very little about—giant pumpkin growing—through extensive research. She also talks about how her familiarity with Circleville and its festival, the Pumpkin Show, was a big help in writing the book. PowerPoint slides include amazing pictures of giant pumpkin patches and fun photos of the actual festival. Also covered is the revision process and how Marlane became a writer. There will be time for a brief question and answer period.

At the conclusion of each presentation all students will receive their own Atlantic Giant pumpkin seed to grow or keep as a souvenir!

### Get Real! Turning Life into Fiction

PowerPoint slides will show pictures of the author's childhood St. Bernard dog, Heidi, who inspired the story. The publication process will also be addressed. There will be time for a brief question and answer period.
